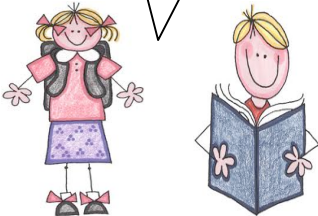
8th Grade Lunch for Friday, October 14:

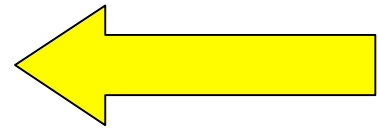
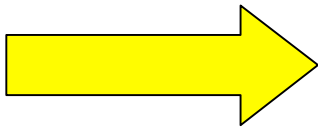

The Centers for Disease Control recommends that all children ages 6 months through 18 years receive the flu vaccine annually. Influenza can cause serious illness among persons in any age group, but severity is greatest among children.

Annual flu vaccination is the most effective way to prevent influenza infection.

The Greenfield Health Department will hold a special flu clinic for school age children. This is a walk-in clinic and no appointments are necessary. Children will be seen on a first come, first served basis. Parents MUST accompany their children to the clinic.

The Health Department will administer primarily the Flu Mist (nasal spray). A limited supply of Fluzone (shot) is available for those unable to receive the mist.



Cost of the vaccine is \$10.00*

*No child will be turned away for inability to pay.
