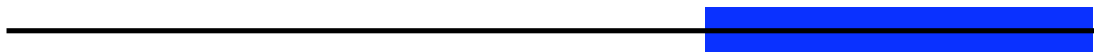
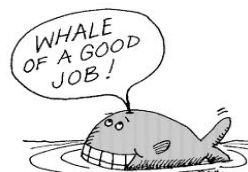



The difference is that "trunkers" (adult members of Our Father's Lutheran School/Church/Day Care) hand out goodies from their cars, trucks, and/or vans. Trunkers gather at Our Father's and form a circle of vehicles with trunks (or back end of vehicle) facing the center of the circle. The children, dressed in their costumes, move from vehicle to vehicle to "beg" for treats rather than go door to door.

The event will be more than just treats, as children may occasionally be required to perform tricks to receive a reward. Games of luck and skill will be included for candy or other prizes, information about our church and school will be available, and even a campfire and hot chocolate will be included.
