

# Pre-Kindergarten with Mrs. Koch

We hear God’s Word every day in our classroom. Our teacher uses the Smartboard, so we can see pictures as we hear the Bible story. We always have many questions and we enjoy this time very much. We know that Jesus loves us and died for each one of us. It always makes us happy to talk about our Savior.

We know many letters and their sounds now. If you ask us what the first letter of a word is, many times we can tell you. We need practice writing our letters, so we are making a special letter book. It is fun to color the letters in different ways. Our teacher lets us use smelly markers, and that makes coloring even more fun! We LOVE when our teacher reads to us, and our teacher enjoys seeing our faces when we are enjoying a good story. Sometimes our teacher sings us a story and it is fun when we get to sing along.

Our math skills are growing every day, too. We can count in order and are beginning to write some numbers. We enjoy making patterns with beads on pipe cleaners. ABAB patterns are the easiest, ABCDEF patterns are a little more difficult. We enjoy the order of all sorts of patterns!

Sometimes we look at something and try to count it without pointing to the objects; that is a little bit harder, but some of us can do it.

This week we painted with our watercolors. Our teacher demonstrated how to use them, and we listened attentively. We were able to paint our picture, and some of us painted grass, trees, houses, an apartment, people, sun, fruit on the tree, shapes, and fire. Some of us experimented with color on our paper. As we dipped our paint brushes in the water to clean them, we were thrilled to see all the lovely colors of the water.

Since it snowed this week, we thought we would share pictures of us out in the snow a few weeks ago. We saw that it was snowing outside just like a snow globe! Our teacher said we should get outside right away! Nora said to our teacher, “We can have snowflakes on our eye lashes, just like the song.” (Our teacher sings, “My Favorite Things” from the Sound of Music when she reads a beautifully illustrated book about the song.) We rushed outside, and we were so happy to have the snow fall on our faces! Some of us really had snowflakes on our eyelashes, too! We couldn’t believe it! Even though we enjoyed this day, we are all VERY excited for the trees to bud again and warmer days.
