
News from Martin Luther High School: Martin Luther High School will once again be offering **Summer Programs** (see attached); Registration closes May 31.

Science class has been loud and soft, high and low because we are learning about sound and light. Decibels will measure how loud or soft a sound is and pitch is how high or low a sound is. We try to keep our learning time at 10 dB (falling leaves) or 30 dB (whispering). We have plenty of time to use our 60 dB voices while we answer questions and play at recess.
